Linda opened the meeting and welcomed the guests. Kinnan Golmon introduced himself and spoke about his organization.

Approval of Consent Agenda: Minutes were approved (Nol moved, Andrew seconded, unanimous). Treasurer's Report: approved unanimously (Glen moved, Art seconded)

Old Business

Linda: SARP Grant update, Scott will continue to take the lead on the restoration site demonstration area at the SLSP. Signage will be needed. We need six more site visits. Our workshop obligation has been filled.

Linda updated the Board on several illegal dams, also covered in the LRWA January Newsletter.

Linda also updated the Board about the Liberty Hill Wastewater Case: the SOAH Law Judges have recommended the lowest level of Phosphorus ever recommended, guest Kinnan Golman also updated on this item. One more step however: the TCEQ Commissioners will have to approve or amend the SOAH recommendation at one of their regular meetings in February or March.

Linda: Arundo grant update, TPWD approved an extension for 2024 with a budget \$10,025 for 2024.

Linda: Time for the LRWA 2024 Membership drive. (we currently have around 140 paid members, Andrew concurred a listserve of well over 700). Discussion ensued. After Linda prepares mailing labels and other materials for the letters, the Board will meet for an envelope stuffing party.

Andrew Burnard reported on the LRWA website (latest was adding the Jan. 2024 newsletter page), also pertinent news from attending Junction City Council meetings. Hill Country Alliance has been assisting with matching infrastructure grants to the city, but one hiccup when it was discovered that Junction citizens' median income was now too high for some of the grants. So, now HCA is looking for more grants
