Funding for conservation work on private lands is being offered through the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Landowner Incentive Program Watershed Funding Series. This funding is specifically available to landowners located within the north and south fork reaches of the Llano River watershed and the James River Watershed (property does not have to include a riparian area to be considered and all projects potentially benefitting the watershed are eligible – riparian corridor enhancement; invasive species control; fence out projects; alternate water source projects; upland brush control, improved grazing practices, etc.).
