Megan Bean from Texas Parks and Wildlife shared these photos she took of the Llano River at Llano. The above photo was taken May 22<sup>nd</sup> when the river was flowing 3,770 cfs; the bottom photo is from May 25<sup>th</sup> with the river four feet higher at 15,800 cfs.

Yesterday, for the third time since the last Friday, the Llano topped 10,000 cfs in Llano. Yesterday's flow was the largest of the three at 26,700 cfs or 2 ½ feet higher than the photo of May 25<sup>th</sup>.

On average, folks in Llano can expect to see the river reach 9,100 cfs once every year, 17,400 cfs once every two years, and 41,100 cfs once every five years.
