Llano River Watershed Alliance and Llano River Field Station

Flooding causes Sewage Spill into Llano

Heavy rains (over 6 inches) during the early Monday morning hours sent flood waters down Oatman Creek in Llano, rupturing a sewer line and sending at least 150,000 gallons of sewage into Oatman Creek and on to the Llano River.

Due to floodwaters, City crews were unable to divert the wastewater flow into a temporary holding tank and shut



down the damaged sewer line until 4pm on Tuesday.

The City of Llano issued a boil warning notice for persons with private drinking water wells within ½ mile of the spill site. Oatman

Creek is on the east side of Llano, downstream of the City's municipal water supply intake.

Many of us are not aware that Texas Parks & Wildlife maintains a record book of "Junior Angler" fish records for fish caught in the Llano River. Evidence of this is that currently there are no Junior Angler records from the Llano River for the following species: Largemouth bass, Guadalupe bass, any type of perch, any type of catfish, gar or carp. Therefore, even the smallest of these can become a TP&W record until later broken (must weigh at least 2 ounces to be a record). Junior Angler records are waiting to be set for each of these types of fish in each of the following categories: spinning rod, flyrod, bow fishing and trotline. Youth under 17 are Junior Anglers.
